PE and Sport Premium Funding Report 2015 – 2016

<p>How much is the PE and Sports Premium Funding?</p>	<p>The PE and Sports Premium Funding is additional funding from the Government to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. It is also for improving the health and wellbeing of primary pupils.</p> <p>The allocations for the academic year 2015/16 was calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 4 and those age 5 in Reception, as recorded at the January 2015 Census as follows:</p> <p>Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8,000 plus £5 per eligible pupil; and schools with 16 or fewer eligible pupils receive £500 per eligible pupil.</p> <p>Total number of pupils eligible for the grant = 112 pupils Harrold Lower School received £8 560 in total for the academic year 2015/16.</p>	<p>£8 560</p>

How will the Sports Premium Grant be spent?	Harrod Lower School will use the grant to improve provision for all our pupils in the following ways:	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To buy into the Bedford Borough School Sports Partnership. This gives our pupils access to inter school competitions and young leader training. This package included 6 inter school competitions, 2 intra-school competitions, 2 sports coaches (half a term for each), Bikeability (Year 4) and a number of twilight/Inset days of specialist PE training 	£2500

<p>What is the impact of the Sports Premium Grant?</p>	<p>By July 2016 (end of the academic / school year), we expect the impact to be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increased opportunities for all of our pupils to access a wider variety of PE and Sports • Opportunity to develop the competitive element of sports and the skills of sportsmanship • Increased opportunities for our pupils with sporting talents to compete with pupils with similar skills • Increased opportunities for all pupils to compete with pupils from other schools in a range of sports • Developed pupil understanding of the importance of keeping fit and healthy and ways that they can improve their health and fitness. • Pupils who are fitter, healthier and are motivated to continue to participate and improve. • Increased numbers of pupils taking part in a range of PE or Sports clubs or activities • Achieving the Sainsbury's School Games Bronze Award and be working towards the Silver Award 	
<p>What are the identified priorities for the next academic year?</p>	<p>Identified Priorities for Forthcoming Year 2016 - 2017:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 'Buy-back' into the Bedford Borough's SSCO's annual PE development scheme again as feedback from staff has again indicated this provides great opportunities for children and for staff CPD. • Continued CDP for the PE Subject Lead in leading the subject to ensure high quality teaching throughout the school • Time to be given to the PE Subject Lead to monitor the impact of CPD and assess the quality of teaching and learning of PE across the school through lesson observation and subsequent feedback to staff at staff meetings. • Purchase of tablets / devices for pupils to record evidence of their activities which can also be used for peer and self-assessment within their lessons. • Further PE resources may be required so this should be monitored and reviewed through staff consultation during staff meetings. • Allocated time for the PE Subject Lead to lead the subject including lesson observations; development of a whole-school assessment system by funding supply cover to release the PE Subject Lead from their teaching commitments on a regular basis. • Enhance and maximise activities for the children by providing a wide range of game and physical opportunities 	
<p>Who monitors the spending of the Sports Premium Grant?</p>	<p>The use of the Sports Premium Grant will be monitored and is reviewed by Governors through reporting to the Governors' School Development Committee, Resources Committee and FGB. Visits are also made to the school by the PE Link Governor to meet with the PE Subject Lead.</p>
