



## Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) – Report 2015 -2016

<b>Overview</b>	<p>The pupil premium is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers.</p> <p>2015 – 2016 - Funding received by schools = £1300 per pupil</p>

<b>Impact of Pupil Premium Spending 2015-16</b>	<p>The school's evaluation of its own performance is aimed to be rigorous. Tracking of progress over time for each pupil is thorough, and so we can identify any identifiable change in trends and develop sensible strategies and interventions to encourage and support improvement.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A wide range of data is used – achievement data, pupils' work, observations, learning walks, case studies, and staff, parent and pupil voice</li> <li>• Assessment Data is collected half termly so that the impact of interventions can be monitored regularly</li> <li>• Assessments are closely moderated and discussed with class teachers and Key Stage leader to ensure the data is accurate</li> <li>• Teaching staff attend and contribute to pupil progress meetings each term and progress of individual pupils is reviewed</li> <li>• Regular feedback about performance is given to children and parents</li> <li>• Interventions are adapted or changed if they are not working</li> <li>• Case studies are used to evaluate the impact of pastoral interventions, such as on attendance and behaviour</li> <li>• A designated member of the SLT maintains an overview of pupil premium spending</li> <li>• A governor will be given responsibility for Pupil Premium</li> </ul> <p>Evidence to support Impact of Pupil Premium Spending 2014-15</p> <p>We will use data from Raise Online, Year 4, KS1, Phonics, EYFS, Perspective Lite (Local Education Authority data summary) as well as whole school data to evaluate impact in terms of attainment and progress.</p>	

Impact upon Pupils In receipt of PPG	75% of pupils achieved or exceeded their individual targets.  50% of pupils achieved or exceeded national expectations at the end of the year
